The man thought nothing of it, and he sat there waiting for the wings to enlarge to support the butterfly. However, that never happened. The butterfly spent the rest of its life unable to fly, crawling around with small wings and a swollen body. Despite the man's kind heart, he didn't understand that the restricting cocoon and the struggle needed by the butterfly to get itself through the small hole were God's way of forcing fluid from the body of the butterfly into its wings to prepare itself for flying once it was free.

When we feel life is a challenge we might remember that 'all sunshine makes a desert'. If you are a gardener or farmer you'll understand the importance of working in all weathers and the need for both sunshine and showers.

Our trials are not a punishment but a way to strengthen our souls.

Galatians 6:9 says 'Let us not become weary in doing good, for at the proper time we will reap a harvest if we do not give up.'

I'm determined to remain focused on my weight loss goal. May we all remain focused on doing good too knowing we will reap a harvest at the proper time.

Maria Pennington, who had been in the jewellery trade for 44 years, having worked in London as a window dresser, jewellery designer and formerly at Winsor Bishop in Norwich joined us at our July meeting. She illustrated with photographs different types of jewellery and how the fashions of the day had influenced styles of jewellery. She explained how the Victorian and Edwardian style celebrated nature and the female form whereas the Art Deco period had influences from Egypt and the Far East. In the 1930's jewellery was often split apart to use separately as earrings, bracelets and tiaras. By the 1940's jewellery was getting bigger and bolder and during the 1950's and 1960's jewellery started to incorporate other materials than gemstones. After her talk members were invited to view a table display of jewellery.

In August we will be visiting Bury St. Edmunds on our annual outing but you are welcome to join us on the second Thursday of the month at Wacton Village Hall at 7.30pm when our speaker for September will talk about being a teacher in local prisons.







Red Wings - Tasburgh

Eleven of us met at Long Stratton co-op car park, 3 cars were used to journey along A140 to Tasburgh., just beyond this village we parked at the lay-by (almost opposite Foundry nursery).

We commenced the walk just a few yards beside the busy A140 road, then we turned left onto Boudicca Way footpath. In a field we saw several horses grazing on grass. Almost the entire walk was on the Red Wings horse sanctuary.

We passed beside a wood plantation of fairly immature deciduous trees. It was noted that protective plastic wrap around their trunks had never been removed and consequently the plastic had grown into the trunks and some plastic was poking out of the bark – a misfortune for these trees.



Our walk took a circular incline passing fields, all housing Red Wings rescued /retired horses. It was pleasing to see to that they were in good care – most horses were quite interested in us and came to say hello. A gentle stroke down the nose was acceptable – only a few took it as an invitation to attempt a chomp at fingers.

We passed Woodhouse Farm and then continued on along bridleways and went through several kissing gates. Then we entered a wooded area and found ourselves in an opening revealing a treasure: St Mary's Church of Saxlingham Thorpe. The church, very ruinous, had a square tower and was built of flint stone — a notice provided information that is was built in the late 11th century and apparently it is still used for worship on occasions! Being the month of August the season was turning autumnal and berries in the hedge; sloes, blackberries and guelder rose were ripening, there were also hazel nuts — all fairly abundant.

Several types of fungi abounded in the grass – parasol mushrooms, toadstools and a fairy ring seen in an open field – the grass mown short - the brilliance of the green was vivid because of the recent rains.

Thistle down seeds adorned the edge of bridle ways and yellow flowers brightened the palette: tansy, St John's wort and perennial sow-thistle and rag wort (which is known to be poisonous to horses).

In a field of tall dry grasses 2 roe deer looked out at us. 14 pied wag tails in another field foraging and above; 4 buzzards high up over a green wood canopy. There was also seen a kestrel on the wing.

The walk had come full-circle and we found ourselves on Boudicca Way and then onto A140, Ipswich road, back to our cars. Thank you Louise for leading such an enjoyable walk. We meet 1st Monday of the month at 10am near the co-op car park, Long Stratton. New walkers are very welcome
