We reported after Remembrance Day that the Tommy's had all been vandalised with the bayonets being cut off. Community Consultation for Night Skies

BikeActive Norfolk

BikeActive Norfolk founded as an unincorporated voluntary organisation in November 2021 and began operating as a disability cycling group in August 2022. We would use our specialist cycling equipment to give anyone with a disability a cycling experience, riding as a group along a 3.5 mile low traffic route at Earsham, starting at the village hall. Initially we ran fortnightly and once a month from November until the following March.

Initially we ran two sessions per running at 1030/1130hrs but it soon became apparent that another session was required and we began to run weekly and added a 1230hr session. We also added another route at Topcroft, starting from Topcroft Sports and Social Club. Through the spring, summer and autumn we would run weekly, alternate Friday's from Topcroft, alternate Monday's from Earsham.



We had acquired a plethora of specialist disability cycling equipment including an E assist side by side tandem trike, an E assist semi recumbent trike, an E assist Tadpole trike, an E assist wheelchair transporter and an E assist wheelchair tandem trike, as well as a rear steer tandem trike and many other trikes. We pride ourselves on having gotten every client who has presented to us, out cycling. Some may need to be piloted by our trained volunteers, others can cycle themselves choosing the appropriate piece of equipment having had an initial assessment. Rider clients presenting with carers would be accompanied by those carers on the rides using the many standard cycles BikeActive Norfolk also possesses.

So far we have taken rider clients out with disability, illness or injury ranging from: - Heart disease, dementia, stroke recovery, multiple sclerosis, cerebral palsy, learning disability, autistic spectrum disorder, para cerebellum, lupus, limb amputation and knee and hip replacement/issues.

We have a policy to NEVER ask anyone's illness, injury or disability, so as not to preclude those who may not wish to discuss their issue. We only assess people in regard to what cycle they can ride.

All our volunteers attend a yearly safeguarding course and are appropriately DBS checked. Some have trained in First Aid qualifications and some of us are Cycling UK ride leaders and BikeAbility Instructors.

Thus far we have given out over 400 adult rides to fifty individual clients. During the summer months our sessions usually attract between 10 and 16 rider clients which is as much as our 25 volunteers can be expected to help.

After running for eighteen months in Spring 2024 it became clear there was need of a children and young people group. This had to be in an entirely traffic free environment and we selected the multi-use games area at Manor Road playing field, Long Stratton, which is the town most of our volunteers come from.

We began running the Junior group at Easter 2024. Using a plethora of trikes, go-karts and quadracycles, many we had collected from closed children's centres and serviced and made safe. We ran every Wednesday in Norfolk school holidays from Easter until the end of October half term. We ran sessions at 1pm and 2pm, and provided equipment for children who would need to be piloted such as those in wheelchairs and those unable to pedal or steer themselves. In 2024 we ran ten sessions and gave out 174 rides to 55 different rider clients

In 2025 we have adopted the same running procedure but the sessions are 40 minutes long between 1300hrs and 1340hrs, and 1340hrs and 1420hrs. The last 40 minutes is given over to a session with the Long Stratton Youth Group which has proven very popular and is a session that sees both disabled and able bodied children cycling together, which is wonderful to behold.

In 2025 BikeActive Norfolk began fundraising £12k toward an E assist Chat Rickshaw. This allows parents and carers who struggle to cycle to accompany their children/charges at both the adult and children's groups.

We are also hopeful that it will form the basis of a Community Transport hub in Long Stratton at which people with illness, injury or disability or who are elderly can be ridden around Long Stratton and its environs, Monday to Friday between 10-1200hrs and 1200hrs and 1400hrs. Allowing these people to shop, visit the GP or pharmacist, the library or church and this service will require only a small donation. We will require more volunteers to make this happen, but as Long Stratton is bypassed, I am hopeful the local people will buy into this idea, as cycling and walking in the town becomes more the norm.

To date we have raised £85k for transport, storage, equipment, third party liability insurance, training and servicing. We raise about £2k yearly from client donation and our annual fundraiser, the rest by charitable funding subscription.

In May 2024 we became a Charitable Incorporated Organisation, Charity Commission number 1207612.
