St Michael's Road

St Michael's Road in Long Stratton runs from Norwich Road and connects to Swan Lane.

It is often used as a cut through for those wanting to avoid the Swan Lane / Norwich

Road junction.



This is illegal!



St Michael's Road is a 'No Through Road' meaning that it is illegal to use it as a cut through. In one month the Speed Activated Monitor captured 18,534 vehicle movements coming from Norwich Road to Swan Lane with a top speed of 45mph! Police regularly monitor activity and we would like to ask all to abide by the law and stop using it as a cut through.

Community Emergency Volunteers

The Community Emergency Volunteer project has been created in response to local emergency situations and in collaboration with the Community Resilience team at South Norfolk District Council

Roles may include checking in on neighbours and local residents, distributing food, water or blankets, shovelling snow or delivering sandbags.


No experience is needed, just a willingness to help.

1800 Homes & Bypass



In our last newsletter, we advised that the development and bypass had been delayed by Nutrient Neutrality. This however has not stopped the investigative works needed to support the delivery of the bypass by Norfolk County Council.

Archaeological works were commenced on 1st August and will run until 4th November.

The archaeological works are being conducted in five key areas, four of which are on the eastern side of Long Stratton, with the fifth area located to the north of Long Stratton, on the western side of the existing A140 Norwich Road.

They have also been looking at trial holes which identifies where existing utilities and land drains are in the area.

Members of Long Stratton Council recently met with Norfolk Wildlife Trust and the Environmental officer at South Norfolk about how to maintain and develop the green infrastructure ensuring public open spaces and wildlife are protected with the delivery of the development and bypass. Several objectives were discussed and we will continue to work together to ensure delivery of those objectives. For more information please visit the Council's website.

Playground update.

The Council is still invested in refurbishing the playground. We are currently seeking grants to assist us in completing this task. At the time of writing we have secured £10,000 from the National Lottery and we are waiting to hear if we have been successful for £5,000 from Saffron. We are hoping work will take place in the new year.

Christmas is fast approaching and we are working towards a brilliant Christmas event for you on the 2nd December starting at 4pm. Speed Activated Machine—SAM2

The Council, through a Parish Partnership Bid with Norfolk County Council secured a SAM2 and it has been positioned in various locations around Long Stratton. Most recently it has been positioned on Flowerpot Lane. Flowerpot Lane is 20mph, here are the findings.

Between the 8th July and 10th September there were a total of 116,256 vehicle movements. This is the total travelling towards the traffic lights and does not include the vehicle movements coming from the other direction.

The top speed was 45mph, over double the speed limit!

The Council are interested in purchasing another SAM2 device, again through the Parish Partnership Bid, we are keen to get a full picture of the traffic and speed used in Long Stratton, this information will be passed to the Police so they can take action where required.



Lets talk about vandalism!

On the 26th September in the evening, a person who was caught on CCTV smashed the Council noticeboard. The noticeboard cost the Council £385. We will now have to pay to get it repaired.

Over the summer holidays, individuals were caught on CCTV kicking the side of the house in the play area damaging it. The Council had to pay for new materials to make it right so that it could be used. Individuals were also caught ripping up the safety matting in the play area and spreading soil on all the equipment. The Council will need to pay to replace the

matting and wasted officer resource to clear up the soil. Individuals were also caught climbing on top of the container which although no cost to the Council it is very dangerous. Sadly it is a few that spoil it for all. Please can everyone speak to their family members and make them aware of these incidences. The police have been notified in all cases and where possible the Council will prosecute.
