How does your garden grow?

Summer is here! As I write this we are in the middle of a heat wave which depending on who I speak to is either welcomed or endured. Of course, we Brits tend to complain whatever the weather. Personally, I find the heat a little unbearable and draining which I sense is shared by some of the plants in my garden and particularly the lawn, which seems to have stopped growing and has turned brown and crispy.

It got me thinking about resilience and how to deal with adverse conditions. Some of the plants withstand the dry conditions through internal adaptions such as changes to their leaves or root system in order to retain or access as much water as possible. Some like grass go into dormancy to conserve energy until rain returns. And still others require me to water them if they are going survive at all.

I think there is a lot we can learn from how plants deal with stress and adverse conditions; I particularly like the idea of going dormant which for me usually means a good sleep. However, the most important thing seems to be knowing what my source of refreshment is or what gives me life. Sometimes this might mean drawing on internal resources of some kind but more often than not it is reaching out for support and comfort from those around me.

As a Christian of course, my greatest source of strength and peace comes from my relationship with God. In fact, Jesus compared being in a relationship with him, like being a branch of a vine which draws life from the vine itself.

BIKE ACTIVE NORFOLK

Well after a hiatus of a month, here is a bit more BikeActive Norfolk news.

Our 24HR edurance ride on disability cycles on the multi-use games area at Long Stratton Town Council pavilion went really well. People supported, our," Just Giving", page and people attended as our MP Ben Goldsborough opened proceedings at 10am

At midday the race started and some of our disabled rider clients got in on the action, cycling laps from the Le Mans style, start, and pedalling and participating through the 24hrs. We were joined by many local people who helped us cycle and get through 24hrs and at the end of it we had cycled 4115 laps of the MUGA and covered 430miles on our disability cycles. We'd also raised approximately £2300, some of which will go toward funding the new Chat Rickshaw service after the town is bypassed. Councillor Alison Thomas also gave us £1000 from her Highways Budget for the Rickshaw service, so we hope to get it up and running on the bypass being complete. At the very latest we'll be offering a service by Spring 2026

BikeActive Norfolk Junior our group for disabled children continues to run through the Norfolk summer school holidays with sessions on the 30th of July, 6th , 13th and 20th of August on the multi-use games area at the Town Council offices. Sessions are at 1300hrs and 1340hrs . So if you are the parent or carer of any child with a disability then please bring them along to enjoy the joys of cycling in a safe environment. *See our website BikeActiveNorfolk.org*



REALLY RURAL

At Forncett St. Mary Village Hall the first problem was what to wear. It was warmish but showers were forecast so most of us had a light waterproof that came on and off as decisions were made between being too hot or too wet. Nine of us set off down a field of broad beans (animal fodder, so not at all tempting) beside the church, admiring the swathes of lesser knapweed - NOT thistles! - and marjoram growing beside the path. We then entered a field of Friesians, who didn't even bother to turn their heads to look at us, and over a broad stream beautiful with purple loosestrife. In the next field we passed over a gate (yes, I did mean over; the gate was off its hinges and conveniently laid over a patch of deep mud!), up the field and then right through a squeeze gate, gallantly held open by a chivalrous walker, who was also armed with secateurs with which he tackled some ferocious brambles further on. It was just along this path we encountered a memorable sight. One of a small herd of Ayrshires was being milked (see photo) right beside the path, its milk destined not for the supermarket but for the calves. Although it would

have been even more romantic had it been a buxom milkmaid on a three-legged stool and not a machine, it was still lovely to see this traditional rural activity. We were further pleased to meet a couple of men removing no longer needed plastic guards from young trees. So often they are left, littering the countryside with plastic waste. The path continued across a road, past a cow barn, and above water meadows with a most charming view across to the Forncetts. We admired the plentiful tall yellow verbascum. Another squeeze gate and up past the tank museum to the level crossing over the railway line. Our leader ushered us across in plenty of time before



the train was due and we were half-way up the next field (pretty lucerne, another fodder crop) when we turned to see the London train thunder past. We were now on the return journey but soon met with a second problem – a field of impenetrable rape. Since the recce, the rape which had been just passable despite the farmer not having left a path (which they are obliged to do by law) had grown even taller and thicker; our leader also feared there could have been chemicals sprayed, so we continued some 600 yards down the road to the next footpath, which took us back over the railway via a bridge, past a farm, and onto Wash Lane. Turning right along the next footpath, we at last regained our route at the bottom of the rape field, having added over a mile. Luckily, it was a most pleasant mile, which included two charming cottages, one thoroughbred horse, a carthorse, and a clover field with lots of butterflies. Now we found ourselves back on the shelf overlooking the water meadow and this time we noticed some nearly ripe bullaces which we sampled before retracing our steps to the road. Here the group split, with some returning along the quiet road while others went back through the fields to meet again at the church, where we thanked Christine for leading a most enjoyable walk.
