1. To receive apologies for absence
Councillor Ian Mortimer gave apologies for purposes of ill health, these were accepted by the Council.

5. To allow members of the public and district and county councillors to speak - max 15 Minutes
District Councillor Alison Thomas's report. Update regarding the boxing club. I have tried to approach the management of the boxing club regarding available funding through South Norfolk District Council however, there has been no response from the boxing club.
Greater Norwich Development Partnership proposal was agreed at South Norfolk District Council and is on cabinet agenda for Norfolk County Council and we will await the outcome; however, Long Stratton Area Action Plan is not being amended.
County Council report – a lot of areas have large amounts of surface water, the water on Flowerpot Lane/ Stratton Road junction is in hand. Budget recommendations were agreed this morning, this will go through to full cabinet in February.
Councillor Worsley reported that the hydrants/ pipes are spouting water on the Hempnall roundabout, the contact number was called but there was no answer. Councillor Thomas has also raised this matter and she will chase to find out what is occurring.

Member of the public stated that the lights outside 92 Manor road, LSC 123 streetlight is facing the wrong way, please can this be amended.

Roads still not have been swept, Councillor Thomas was asked if she could enquire. She advised that it was in hand however due to limited resource other works had taken precedence.

This was noted, the Council were satisfied the transaction was carried out appropriately and transparently.

It was resolved to accept Grays funfairs for June 2020, subject to fair weather.

Councillor Alison Thomas advised that there may be a display in the South Norfolk District Council foyer for those that wish to look at the proposal in more detail. Councillors Lansdell and Baker were approved to attend. They were asked for a report to be brought back to Council.
