- 2. To consider apologies for absence

- 3. **To receive disclosures of interest and dispensations**There were no disclosures of interest or dispensation.
- To sign previous planning minutes from meetings held on November 18th 2019
 The minutes of the planning meeting were signed by Councillor Baker as a true copy.
- 5. **To discuss and decide on planning applications received by 5.00pm on 25**th **August 2020 (see below)** Long Stratton Fire Station, 20-22 Swan Lane, Long Stratton, NR15 2XN: Replacement of existing Hose Drying Tower with the erection of a taller Fire Training Tower Facility. Proposal: Demolition of 3no. redundant buildings (retrospective). Location: The Mill, Mill Road Long Stratton NR15 2RU Applicant: Mr Trevor Cullum Application Type: Full Planning Permission. There was no comment on this application as it was retrospective.

Proposal: Demolition of existing buildings and erection of a replacement building Location: The Mill, Mill Road Long Stratton NR15 2RU Applicant: Mr Trevor Cullum Application Type: Full Planning Permission. This was supported.

Proposal: Erection of 2 semi-detached bungalows and garages Location: Hilltop, The Street Long Stratton NR15 2AH Applicant: Sam & Mike Farrell Application Type: Outline Planning Permission. This was objected to on the grounds of Highway access onto the A140.

 - The data was reviewed. It showed 75% of vehicle movements were speeding however the average speed was 26mph. The worst speeding offence was 40 mph.
