BIKE ACTIVE NORFOLK

By the time you read this in early June, BikeActive Norfolk will be preparing for its annual fundraising event, this year a 24hour recumbent race on the multi-use games area of Manor Rd playing field. Taking place over the summer solstice, running from midday on Saturday the 21st of June until midday the following day, our intrepid teams aim to cover as many laps as possible. Starting from a Le Mans style start to taking the chequered flag some 24hrs later, it's likely our teams will be dizzy through their efforts.

We had hoped that other teams would pay an entry fee and join us racing to raise money for the disability cycling group, BikeActive Norfolk, a group that takes adults with any disability, injury or illness on weekly group rides from venues at Topcroft and Earsham, as well as giving a cycling experience to disabled children on the multi-use games area during Norfolk school holidays from Easter until the end of October. To date we have no takers to race against. But this will not stop our racing!

Our A Team of five cycle club standard riders will attempt to go as far as possible in 24hrs. Our B Team will allow unlimited substitution allowing some of our rider clients to get involved, as well as members of the public being able to get involved for a small fee towards our fundraising. Three of our rider clients will participate for the B Team, riding on a handcycle, wheelchair transporter and side by side tandem trike. These amazing people overcome great difficulties to take part. Please come and see their efforts and if you can, be generous.

There will be a Skills Stake, similar to a Sweepstake, in which people will be invited to use statements about distance travelled on cycles in 24hrs to estimate how far the winning team might go, with squares of half a mile from zero to five hundred. The winner will walk away with half the money staked and all those who participate will have helped raise money for a local, voluntary charity that allows people with a disability to have fun, exercise and get out cycling.

There will be the amazing Tour de France exhibition of memorabilia and photo's courtesy of Peter Martin and legendary Tour de France themed cakes by Lisa Martin during daylight hours. And also in daylight hours, our 250-metre roller race time trial in which participants can try to be the fastest over that distance and win prizes for a small fee towards our funds.

BikeActive Norfolk hopes to be able to raise sufficient money and attract sufficient support to set up a low-cost rickshaw service for older and disabled people in the town once the bypass is completed. This requires the purchase of an electric assisted Van Raam Chat rickshaw, similar rickshaws have been used successfully in Thetford and Bury St Edmunds to offer similar schemes. In order to raise the large sums involved, the rickshaw costs £12k, BikeActive Norfolk has to show we can raise some funds ourselves, to date we have raised £8k. Please come and support us in our endeavours to raise more and make this happen. Thank you,


Upcoming Full Council meeting dates

Tivetshall

"Ne'er cast a clout till May is out." We recited this old saying whilst walking into the cold east wind. It was the beginning of May and the hedges were dripping with sprays of white May blossom. But after a week of summery weather it felt like winter had returned.

We parked at the side of The Street, near to a footpath sign, in Tivetshall St Mary. A visitor from London, Mirella, had joined us and soon got chatting to our group of thirteen as we sauntered along the quiet lane. We admired the wisteria and garden plants of the houses we passed before 'climbing' Primrose Hill. We were surrounded by fields of early crops and sentinel trees that lined the road. Before long we heard the roar of traffic and came very close to the A140. Thankfully another quiet road lead us away onto a rural path through woods. At times we followed signposts for Boudicca's Way; a thirty-six mile trail from Diss to Norwich. Fortunately, today we were only on it for a short distance.

At one point walkers in the lead stopped and gazed into a field where two roe deer with antlers bounded through the knee-high wheat. Spongy oak 'apples' had fallen from the oak trees and interesting galls on yellow cress seed pods were among the flora we saw today. Pockets of sunshine between the clouds helped to warm us up and the birdsong was delightful. Along the way we could make out the Shimpling church spire above the trees in the distance. Lovely field views of flowering oil-seed rape brightened the landscape.

Near the end of our walk a horse chestnut tree in full bloom concealed a treat. Surrounded by tall trees the ruin of St Mary's church rose into sight. Past the village war memorial, we entered the south door and stood on the rubble of the fallen tower to see the tracery of the large arched window over the altar. It was said that a sonic boom from a low flying jet plane had caused the tower to collapse into the nave. Nature was reclaiming the

roofless church but it is still visited by people who leave their comments in the visitor's book in a box. Well worth a visit. Ambling north from the church we found a tree-lined path that led to the footpath near to where we'd parked.
