I have a friend that I have breakfast with regularly. We chat about anything and everything as friends often do. The past four months however a recurring theme has been talking about death and loss, as four of his friends and his two dogs have all died. That's a huge amount of grief to deal with. We talk about them being at peace especially as each has suffered greatly before passing. We talk about eternity and the life to come. However for my friend it is still a huge sadness to deal with before he can properly feel the blessing of having had them in his life.

My wife loves Winnie the Pooh so I loved it when I found this. When Eeyore is feeling sad, Pooh often says things like, "We're sitting here with you, because we are your friends. And true friends don't care if someone is feeling Sad, or Alone, or Not Much Fun To Be Around At All. True friends are there for you anyway".

A heavy start to this piece but I want to share a story that I read years ago which as a keen studier of military history, has always appealed to me and helped me when dealing with difficulties, large and small. It is of an aging lady who was a regular church goer who lost a brother, husband and son in the space of a few years. When she was asked by the minister how she coped so well she replied that just as a general places his best and most loyal troops in the centre of the battle, to encourage others, she felt she had been placed by her Saviour in the centre for others to draw strength from her. A wonderful way of thinking of it.

I have been asked too often by people if their suffering was a punishment from God. My reply has always been no.

At a recent Bible study we were looking at John Chapter 15 and the words in verse 2 '... while every branch that does bear fruit he prunes.' It provoked some discussion about how we are pruned. Often it is through adversity the unimportant is stripped away so we can grow stronger and bear more fruit as it says later. We often receive empathy, love and support through our trials. That can lead to our own ability to understand others pain and teach us how to pass on love and support in turn.

So if you are suffering or know someone who is remember this may be a chance to refocus on what is important, which is always to love and care for one another.

I love the month of May. The world around us looks brighter, greener and sprinkled with colours of flowers in every nook and corner. There's a spring in our step and one wants to be out in the garden. This year, the practice PPG have been focusing on delivering a Heart Health event evening at the Newton Flotman community hall. When I initially heard about the topic, I wondered why the PPG had chosen the Heart as its theme. It really isn't rocket science. We hear about someone having some form of heart disease whether Angina, Heart attacks, coronary artery disease or valve problems. These are lifechanging events that affect our lives.

The British Heart Foundation Factsheet January 2025 shows some glaring facts under the heading 'Today in the UK'

- 1. 480 people will die from a heart or circulatory disease
- 2. Around 130 of them will be below 75 years of age
- 3. 270 hospital admissions will be due to a heart attack
- 4. 180 people will die of coronary heart disease
- 5. 7.6 million people are living with a heart or circulatory disease

These are worrying figures. We do have to reflect and consider how we can look after ourselves, look after each other and how we can improve the heart health of the country.

PREVENTION is always the first line. This is all about lifestyle which includes

- 1. Healthy diet
- 2. Stop smoking if a smoker
- 3. Safe drinking levels: 14 units or less in a week
- 4. Regular exercise

#### Risk factors include

- 1. Diabetes: it is crucial to get the HbA1c within safe range
- 2. Hypertension/ high BP reduce salt, exercise, take medication regularly and get the figures to safe levels
- Cholesterol should be checked and if high, look at diet, exercise and if necessary, medication
- 4. Obesity and overweight try hard to get the weight to a safe range In summary, a healthy diet and exercise are crucial. Let us work hard to keep ourselves healthy physically and mentally.

The PPG will let you know as soon as the date for the Heart Health evening has been set. Stay Safe.

#### BIKE ACTIVE NORFOLK

BikeActive Norfolk began getting adults out cycling with any disability, illness or injury in September 2022. Initially uptake was slow, as the concept was new in Norfolk. Adults with ANY disability, injury or illness would attend our group rides of about 3.5 miles on quiet roads that had been properly risk assessed. Any adult with a carer, then the carer would accompany the rider client on the ride.

After closing over the winter months of 2022, we started rides again in March 2023 initially from Earsham village hall and running every other week. Within weeks of starting we had regular rider clients attending. By spring of 2024 we were running weekly with a new venue at Topcroft Sports and Social Club as well as still using Earsham village hall. We had acquired a plethora of specialist disability cycling equipment, including an E assist side by side tandem trike, wheelchair tandem trikes and wheelchair transporters, rear steer tandem trikes, and an E assist semi recumbent trike. These things enabled us to get ANYONE out enjoying cycling

We also launched a children's group during Norfolk school holidays on the multi use games area at Long Stratton at Easter 2024. Despite our having little funding we managed to acquire some old go-karts, quadracycles, trikes and rear steer tandems and trikes for those unable to pilot themselves. This group proved to be a success.

As BikeActive Norfolk will have passed the point at which it has delivered over 500 rides to over 120 different rider clients, it's time to take stock of things. None of this can be achieved without volunteers. Come and join us if you'd like to give something back to the Community. It is fun and as most of our volunteers will say, very rewarding.

June 21st and 22nd see BikeActive Norfolk undertake a 24hr cycle recumbent race on the multi-use games area in Long Stratton to help raise money toward an electrical assist Van Raam Chat rickshaw. We hope to use this for the basis of a community transport hub for elderly and disabled people in our town once the bypass ensures lower traffic levels. Please come and join in. By racing a team or taking part for a short session on the day. Details will be on our website, BikeActiveNorfolk.org as to how you can get involved. Please do.







#### Local Walk

There were 15 of us walking today. We decided who was in whose car and set off to Hapton, there is a small parking area next to St Margaret's Church.

We began our walk to the left of the Church on Holly Lane. We could hear the skylarks as soon as we started to walk. We then took the footpath that zigzagged across the fields to High Road. There was so much fauna and flora along the path; charlock plants with their yellow flowers, and the small bright blue flowers of the alkanet. We turned right and walked along the road to the corner and took a footpath to the right, which took us to a disused quarry where lots of birds and butterflies could be seen. We went through the kissing gate and turned right along Norwich Road then left onto Flordon Common. We




walked beside a pretty stream that weaved its way through the



common. We saw in the base of an Alder Tree where a field mouse has hidden his winter supply of cones. There were two roe deer near the marsh and a small patch of colt's foot plant with its small, bright, yellow dandelion-like flowers. There were a few butterflies seen as well; speckled wood, holly blue, green vein, white orange tip and a peacock to name a few. We came out on The Street in Flordon where there was a red telephone box that is being used as a book exchange. We walked a short distance on the road then turned right onto a footpath that took us through Redwings Horse Sanctuary. As we started up the pathway we could hear woodpeckers drumming and saw

lots of horses and donkeys grazing in the fields and through the stable area. Our bird watchers amongst us spotted white wagtails in the paddocks, they also spotted swallows that have arrived here for the summer. Then we were back on Holly Lane and wandered through the Church yard with a very large magnolia tree which was in full bloom. There were lots of primroses and wild purple violets almost forming a carpet alongside the path, and we were back to where we had parked the cars.
