Remembering

The end of October and November are very much a season of remembering. On the 30th October was the Memorial service at St Mary's church, a time to remember those we love who are no longer with us. Remembrance Sunday this year is on the 13th November. Last year Covid meant that the parade did not happen, and the service was a much smaller one, but this year we should be back to normal. All are welcome to come and participate in the short service at the war memorial and in the church.

This year Remembrance will have an extra meaning and poignancy for us - although conflict is always happening somewhere in the world, we are now in a time when war has returned to Europe with the Russian invasion of Ukraine. Every year we remember with gratitude the sacrifice of so many of our people in the two world wars, and in subsequent conflicts when our forces have been involved. At the Remembrance service we always pray for peace as well, and for those who are suffering through the consequences of war. And this year we will include not only the Ukrainian people who are experiencing such loss and devastation, but also the Russian people - the families who have lost sons, brothers or fathers through the war, and people who are being forced to fight against their will. And we will also be praying for those in leadership, for a just peace, and a better future.

Jesus said, (Matthew chapter 5, verse 9) "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God." Peace, whether in relationships, communities, or countries, or between countries, is something that may have to be worked for, and that will often be hard work. A just peace may be very difficult to achieve in the current situation, and it seems that things may even be getting worse by the time you read this. Jesus also said "Love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you" (Matthew chapter 5 verse 44) - something even harder to do than work for peace, because it goes against our natural instincts. But all who follow Jesus are called to pray for those who would wish them harm.

At the Remembrance service we usually sing "Make me a channel of your peace", based on a prayer of St Francis, and it sums up much of what we have to do to work for peace and to bring God's love and comfort to those in need and his light into dark situations. And there is another song which begins "Let there be peace on earth and let it begin with me".

We are praying for peace in the world, but we all have a responsibility to work for peace in whatever situations we find ourselves.

A huge "thank you" to everyone who helped to tidy up St. Mary's churchyard on Saturday 17th September. 18 people arrived with strimmers, lawn mowers, hedge trimmers and rakes which enabled all the long grass from the conservation area to be cut and cleared. In addition, the area near the A140 was mowed and many of the hedges and low-hanging tree branches over the path were trimmed. It made a massive improvement in just a couple of hours. Tea and biscuits were enjoyed during a break. A special thanks to Martin who supplied 11 large skip bags to collect all the cuttings and then took them to a composting facility with the help of Nick.

As the weather has become cooler and wetter the grass is still growing, so we plan to have another session on Saturday 12th November at 10am. Please come and join us, bringing tools (as above) if you can. Everyone said how enjoyable it was, and it enabled us to meet new people.

Thanks also to everyone that organised and supported the Bingo evening. £501 was raised for St. Mary's Building Repair Project which is fantastic. This will help towards the urgent repairs to the north aisle roof and replacement of the stolen lead from the extension roof (with a different roofing material which is less attractive to thieves). Work is due to commence on 10th October and should be finished in 6 to 8 weeks. In total we need to raise about £500,000. Despite the vacancy, church services are continuing every Sunday as normal thanks to great efforts from our small Ministry Team (who also cover 7 other churches) and help from visiting clergy. At this time of year there are several special services approaching which are also going ahead. These include the Remembrance Sunday service (with parade of uniformed organisations) on 13th November, the Advent Carol Service on 27th November and the Christingle service on Christmas Eve. We will also be holding our Christmas Tree Festival between 10th and 13th December. We look forward to welcoming you to these services and events.

Movember - Men's Health Awareness Month

November arrives and it brings with it several issues — winter, energy bills, flu, covid and then Christmas soon with its associated expenses. This month however has much more to it. It is the month dedicated to men's physical and mental health. International Men's Health day is November 19th. Why is there a month dedicated to Men's health? I looked at various websites to find an appropriate and justifiable answer. The one I liked best was on the City, University of London Student hub website: This month is Men's Health Awareness Month which marks an important time to talk about the mental health of men and how we can reduce stigma, do away with societal expectations and increase the likelihood of support uptake among men. The charity MIND which deals with mental health, published a document in December 2020, right in the middle of a disastrous period of the pandemic: Get it off your chest. Men's health 10 years on. Some of the key facts from it were;

- 1. Two in five men (43%) regularly admit to feeling worried or low, an increase from 37% in 2009.
- The number of men who have suicidal thoughts when feeling worried or low has doubled to 10% since 2009
- 3. Men are still more likely than women to drink alone, go to the pub with friends, or take recreational drugs to relax when feeling worried or down.
- 4. Men's preferred alternatives to being prescribed medication are face-to-face therapy and physical activity.

The important take home message from me is 'Never hesitate to ask for help.' Asking for help is not a failure. Asking for help can change your life and thereby improve your quality of life.

Tale of the milk round and cider effects

Claud and George Brooks were two brothers who lived together at Tharston and were renowned and revered for cider making. Many people from miles around who had large quantities of windfall apples would sack them up in the autumn and take them to Claud and George. On going up to their house there would be sacks and sacks of apples outside their barn waiting to be processed into cider, this required a great deal of skill and hard work, chopping the apples into pulp, pressing out the juice and barrelling it up to ferment. So good was their reputation of cider making that there were even articles written about them in the newspapers and they also appeared on television.

My experience of this was on Saturdy mornings when I collected the milk money, it would always be left on the kitchen tabe alongside a full glass of cider which was their way of showing appreciation, which would not be taken kindly if not consumed, but having said that, for me it was no hardship for it was truely delicious and I really loved their cider, but beware, it had hidden side effects. The rest of the milk round took twenty minutes to finish and that was the time it took the delayed action to hit me. My mind would go and I just couldn't concentrate after that. I used to try to remedy this by drinking a pint of milk, preferably gold top before I got there to give my stomach a lining before collecting their money to offset the hidden effects, but to no avail.

PS Since I wrote this article I had occasion to speak to Dr Malcolm Willis who confirmed that he too could endorse the delicious quality and strength of the Brooks brothers cider, for as a young doctor new to the practice he was called in to make a visit and ended up with the same result as myself.



The Miller's Meanderings

Around 1868 Robert Butler took over the tenancy of the Mill and house in the centre of Wacton Common. He was born in 1837 to Maria and George Butler the miller of Repps with Bastwick, but by 1861 was working as a general farm servant at Meeting Hill Worstead where he met Hannah Flaxman, a dressmaker also living at Meeting Hill. In 1865 they married, he was 26 and she was 39 although in the census of 1871 for Wacton they gave their ages as 33 and 35 respectively, well she was a bit older than him. All seemed to be going alright until about 1887 when Robert entered a 'relationship' with Sarah Ann Bales the 20 year old daughter of a Great Moulton farmer. At the time Sarah was keeping house for her widowed father in one of the pair of cottages at the High Green end of Hallowing Lane. Sarah subsequently had three children Laura in 1888, Sarah Ann in 1891 and Robert in 1893 at Great Moulton.

In the 1891 census Robert and Hannah give their correct ages 52 and 66 respectively. Robert and Hannah move from the Mill House in 1897/8 into a property on the corner of Wash Lane, now known as The Croft. The same year he gets elected as "Overseer" for the Parish Council. By now it is possible that Hannah is becoming unable to cope with normal domestic duties so Sarah Ann Bales and her three children move into the Croft at Wacton with Robert and Hannah Butler.

In the 1901 census the enumerator lists the property as Stratton Road, along with the seven Victoria cottages. Robert then describes himself as a farmer, occupying the field behind the Croft and the field in front, now taken up by the realigned bend in the road and bungalows. Sarah Bales is entered as housekeeper with her children as boarders. Hannah dies in early 1907 aged 82 and later that year Robert married Sarah Bales. The following year Sarah's middle daughter, Sarah Ann Bales, marries Arthur Finch and they move to Aslacton.

In early 1911 Sarah's death is registered in the Blofield district. This suggests Sarah may have been a patient at the Thorpe Lunatic Asylum at the time of her death. On census day, 2nd April, in 1911 Robert Butler and Robert Bales are living at Sarah Ann Finch's house in Aslacton. Laura Bales is out in service in Norwich.

Robert Butler died on 8th May 1911 at Aslacton and in his will he admits that he is the father of the three children of Sarah Ann Bales. He leaves his household effects to be divided between his two daughters, Sarah Ann and Laura, and the outside effects to be divided between Arthur Finch and Robert Bales. He instructs his executors to farm the land for thirty years from his death, until 1941, then to sell the property and divide the money between his three children or the survivor of them. It appears the property was let for some of the 30 years but that's another story.

On a lovely day with white fluffy clouds drifting across a blue sky, nine of us met at Caistor St Edmunds. At the end of the path we turned left, parallel to the A140 and the railway line in the distance just as the 10.30 London train went by. Somehow there's something romantic about a train! We passed the sewage works, which sounds a bit insalubrious but we didn't



notice any odours from it and soon reached the pretty little Tas, which we turned to walk alongside. It was so beautiful and dreamy with the running water, reeds and rushes, the



skeletal outlines of tall summer plants like hogweed and teasel, more lovely like this than when in bloom, and even birdsong, despite it being so late in the year. A pair of swans were busy hoovering up the plentiful algae on the surface. Himalayan balsam was pretty but we were all too aware of its menace in crowding out our local flora. Liz showed us how the pods popped to shoot the seeds a great distance to be carried downstream to successfully propagate itself. Crossing a little bridge, we gazed into the water, seeing tiny fish at play and more swans. Later we heard about the bird flu on the Broads affecting swans but luckily no such dark thoughts were in our minds on this sunny day, and some of us were so mesmerised we discovered we

had fallen miles behind the group and hurried to catch up. We walked all round this last huge field, ending quite near the railway where we were treated to two more trains, one in each direction, and finally turned downhill through the grassy meadow with lovely views of the Roman camp ahead. Most flowers had finished blooming but we managed to identify Aaron's rod and sainfoin among others, and had some excitement when we saw a woodpecker feeding – although he wasn't quite so pleased to see us and promptly flew away. We ended with an interesting circuit of the Roman walls and a visit to the charming little church with its tiled roof and porch of knapped flint. Many thanks to Louise for a splendid walk.
