## BIKE ACTIVE NORFOLK

A quieter month for BikeActive Norfolk in some ways, as we only run our adult group twice a month from Earsham village hall during the winter. The other route we use from Topcroft Sports and Social club is prone to flooding during winter . We will resume weekly running in March 2025 at Earsham village hall and then revert to running alternate Fridays from Topcroft Sports and Social Club and alternate Mondays from Earsham village hall from April 2025. You are welcome to come and join us, see BikeActive Norfolk.org for more details on what we do I am regularly asked." Why as a Long Stratton based charity don't you run rides closer to the town?" The simple answer is traffic conditions with a lack of relatively flat, low traffic volume roads and somewhere with toilets, drink making facilities and parking from which to run. As Long Stratton is being by passed as we speak and lower traffic volumes are predicted in the town centre itis possible that BikeActive Norfolk may offer some services within the realms of the town in the future. Watch this space. Our Junior Group will restart at Easter 2025 on the multi use games arera at Long Stratton Manor Rd playing field, with two forty minute sessions for any child with any disability followed by a forty minute session with the Long Stratton Youth Cafe in conjunction with Anastasia Twigg, the Long Stratton Youth worker. Still lots of things happening in the background for BikeActive Norfolk, with fundraising, servicing of our specialist cycles and our celebrating being together as a group for three years . A chance to celebrate how incredibly far we have come thanks to the help of generous funders, tough fundraising and generous volunteers. A number of volunteers received small trophies for their hardwork and dedication in our community. As a small wholly voluntary charity we are constantly having to raise funds and we are planning a twenty four hour fundraising event in Long Stratton over mid summer night. We hope to involve as many people from the town as wish to get involved, plans to be finalised and published shortly. At present people can support us by supporting the Long Stratton Co-op's fundraising initiative for BikeActive Norfolk. Our thanks to them. Finally can I wish all BikeActive Norfolk volunteers, rider clients and our supporters a wonderful festive period and a happy succesful 2025

## December walk

Can you imagine a four mile walk which incudes two medieval churches; a Norfolk Wildlife Trust site; a pond; several woods; glimpses of some magnificent mansions (visible thanks to the bare branches of winter trees); some second world war relics; a solar farm and a herd of deer (well, that couldn't be planned for)? Add to that the aim to start within a twenty minute drive from Long Stratton and have parking for three or four cars. This is what Liz managed to plan for our December walk by taking us round three intertwined loops starting at Hethel church.

Fourteen of us set off dressed appropriately for the expected rain, though in fact we felt only a few spots. The previous day had been very wet so we were glad of waterproof shoes or boots as we walked across a meadow of long grass. Soon, however we found ourselves with firm ground under the fallen leaves. We were in a wood but the paths were concrete. Among the trees were the remains of a few buildings and possibly an air raid shelter. It was extremely peaceful so it was hard to imagine that this was once the residential area for the near by airfield (now the Lotus works.) As the woodland cleared on our left someone spotted a deer on the far side of a field. Slowly four or five more emerged from the hedgerow. Suddenly they all set off very fast and disappeared before the walkers from the back had a chance to catch a glimpse.

The absence of sun and the presence of plenty of conversation meant that some of

us were quite unaware that we had completed the first circle. A church with tall poplar trees came into sight and we suddenly realized we were back at Hethel. Our cars were in sight though we were on a completely different path heading for the smallest nature reserve in the UK. The Norfolk Wildlife Trust have put a fence and an information board around Hethel Old Thorn, the remnant of a 700 year old hawthorn where Kett's rebels may have met in1549.



From here we followed a footpath to Bracon Ash. Suddenly we were dragged into the 21st century. The hedge on our right was bright with rose hips but on our left was a tall wire fence enclosing a large area of solar panels surrounded by a sea of muddy clay. It was a relief to leave that behind and emerge on the road near the old school at Bracon Ash. A few yards down the road Liz had another loop for us. We turned right along a path past some old cottages. A left turn took us down Poorhouse Lane which brought us out to the B113, a busy road but with a good pavement. We weren't there for long as a footpath took us straight across a field to Bracon Ash church where we had a rest enjoying the peaceful church with its enormous mausoleum attached.

The return journey looked as though it was going to be straight back along the lanes to Hethel. However there was one more treat as we climbed some steep steps into woodland. The final surprise was that this lovely footpath came out right by our cars where Liz completed our enjoyment by handing out Norfolk shortbread to us all!

Everyone is welcome for walks on the first Monday of each month. Meet near the toilets at Long Stratton car park for a gentle walk of about 4 mile
