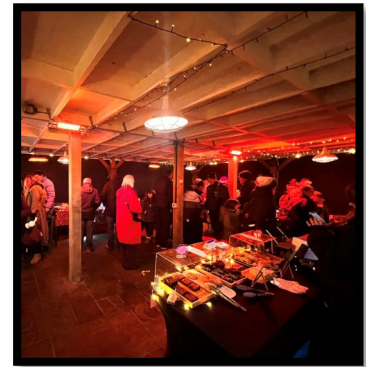

Meet Long Stratton's new Youth Worker, Anastasia Twigg

Following a consultation with young people, it was recognised that young people do not always feel that they have a voice within the community and/or a safe space where they can express themselves.

Long Stratton Town Council (with funding from South Norfolk Council through UK Government's Shared Prosperity Fund) are providing £31,245 to deliver a new project to address this issue.

This project will focus on reaching young people from age 8 upwards who live in Long Stratton and surrounding villages.

The project will run for an initial 12 months starting from 1st January 2024 with a view for it to continue beyond the original funding amount.

We welcome Anastasia and wish her well and are looking forward to what's to come!



Anastasia will be at the Pavilion on Thursday 22nd February from 12pm to 4pm to meet young people and anyone that is interested in supporting the development of youth projects and activities.

The Town Councils Events Committee are starting to prepare for this years community summer event. Last year was a great success and we want to bring everyone together again for an afternoon of fun and entertainment!

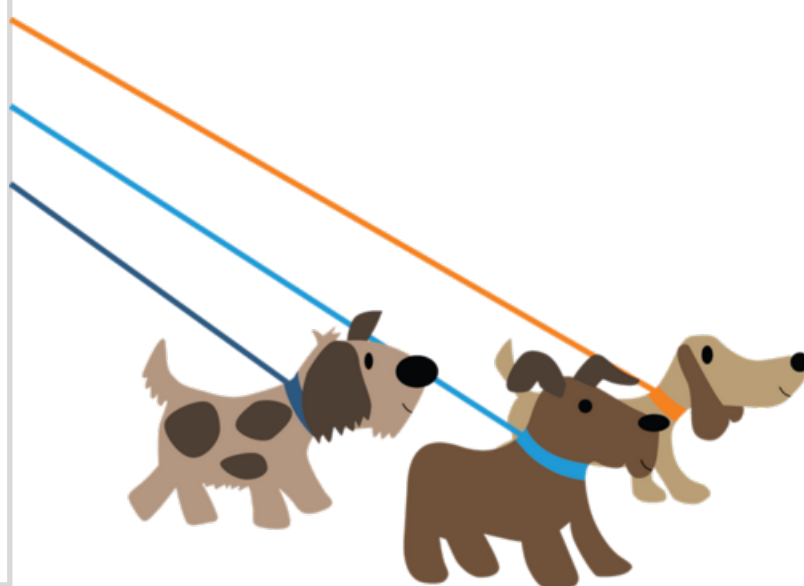
It will be held on Saturday 6th July 2024 on the Manor Road playing fields (times to be confirmed).

Public Information from Norfolk County Council regarding the Long Stratton Bypass

Temporary road closures for preliminary site clearance work in the Long Stratton area, including temporary traffic management, on Church Lane, Edges Lane, Hall Lane, Parkers Lane and A140 (Layby Only).

Work on the new Long Stratton Bypass is currently due to start later in the spring. This scheme will remove through traffic on the A140 from the centre of Long Stratton, improving journey times across the county and support our regional economy.

In order to give the project the best possible start, some site clearance work is needed from early January 2024. Any vegetation removal will be minimal but to ensure the safety of both the public and our contractors, a series of temporary road closures and traffic management will be in place. Weather permitting, the temporary road closures will be intermittently in place between Monday 8 January and Friday 29 March 2024. One layby on the A140 Ipswich Road (north of Wild Rose Farm) will also be closed for the duration of this work.

The temporary road closures will only be implemented when absolutely necessary. The affected roads will remain open and available for free passage at all other times. A Temporary Traffic Regulation Order will be in force when signs are sited. We are unfortunately unable to provide exact dates at this stage as to when each particular road may be affected but will endeavour to provide continuous notice throughout the duration of the works. This will be via advance warning signage at each location, along with clearly signed diversion routes where applicable.

Diversion routes and temporary road closure plans are also available on request.

Access will be maintained throughout for residents/businesses located within the works areas but some minor delays be experienced whilst key activities are in progress.

We understand any disruption on the roads is frustrating and will be working closely with our contractors throughout the project to minimise this as much as possible.

Defibrillators



Long Stratton Town Council has a defibrillator for emergency use situated on the outside wall of the Pavilion on the Manor Road playing fields. There is also a defibrillator now situated alongside the A140 on the front wall of the Police Station. These are available 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

In an emergency dial 999. Tell the call handler that you need access to the defibrillator.

The call handler will give you the access code and then guide you through using the equipment.

The defibrillator should be placed back in the cabinet after use. The pads will then be renewed and the defibrillator reset by the Town Council.

The defibrillator should send an alert to the Clerks office to let us know it has been used.
