I was reminded by our ever-capable Administrator Dawn that it was that time of the month to write an article for the parish magazines. She also suggested a relevant topic for the month of February – healthy eating. This is such a relevant topic at any point in time. We hear so much about obesity and the related co-morbidities, childhood obesity and the impact for the future, the implications for the NHS and the economic implications.

We hear and read about healthy eating and once every so often, a refresher is important. This may help us reflect on our eating habits and make necessary changes with the aim of prevention of several illnesses and improving our physical and mental health.

Health professionals employ the phrase 'healthy eating' frequently. Healthy eating involves eating a balanced diet. Our current healthy eating model in the UK is called the Eatwell guide. There is a scientific basis to this guide, and it looks at the balance of food and drinks needed in our diet. It recommends the amounts of nutrients needed for a healthy state of the body.

I want to add a paragraph about the 5 a day concept. It encourages us to add different types and colours of fruit and vegetables to our diet. This also has a scientific basis. The NHS website gives us 5 reasons to include 5 a day in our diet:

- 1. Fruit and vegetables are a good source of vitamins and minerals, including folate, vitamin C , vitamin A and potassium.
- 2. They're an excellent source of dietary fibre, which can help to maintain a healthy gut and prevent constipation and other digestion problems. A diet high in fibre can also reduce your risk of bowel cancer.
- 3. They can help to reduce your risk of heart disease, stroke and some types of cancer
- 4. Fruit and vegetables contribute to a healthy, balanced diet.
- 5. Fruit and vegetables taste delicious and there's so much variety to choose from.

One does not have to wait for another New Year to make a resolution. Let this February 2025 resolution be about looking after ourselves. The community benefits, the country benefits, the world benefits from individuals who can make the change.

# We thought we would share a Foodbank shift with you.

At St Mary's Church in Long Stratton we are open between 12:30 and 2:30 every Friday. We have a rotation of 3 teams of 4 or 5 volunteers and we often switch around to cover each other. We are at the end of a system which starts with your donations, and which only works because of your generosity, so "Thank you".

In order to be ready for 12:30 we arrive about midday and go through a set of processes. These are easy – we must take everything we need out of the walk-in cupboard and put out what we think we are going to use on the tables.

When we put out the signs at 12:25 we are open for business.

We don't know who or how many people are coming to see us. If the world was working properly, we would see nobody, because there would be no need for anybody to collect a food parcel.

When people arrive, we ask for a voucher number. Voucher numbers are given out by organisations who can offer more help than just a box of food.

Food boxes are delivered to us fortnightly by the warehouse team at the Waveney Foodbank and we give people the correct size box to accompany their voucher. We have a table covered with extra food and extras, like laundry products, toothpaste, nappies and pet food.

And then we sit and wait and drink tea. On a good day there is cake, on a bad day we forget the milk.

We must sort out the cupboard and put away the deliveries.

But before we start, we have to set up our data recording system which is linked to the Waveney Foodbank. In effect this is our stock checking system.

We must record everything on a tablet and as you can imagine in an old building with thick stone walls, there is poor wi-fi signal. We have a hub which we connect to the power supply and plug in the tablet. We then follow the ritual of trying to log-in. On a good day It can be done in 2 minutes including 2 stage validation on the phone.

On a bad day we commit one of the team to continuous muttering, and table slapping, and sometimes chuntering. At that point the rest of us hide in the cupboard and count trolleys. And then we find that the system has been upgraded remotely and nothing works anyway.

But our basic job is to help people. We don't know why they are there, but we do know that they have asked a stranger for help. We try to make everything as stress free as possible, but we know they don't want to be there, so if they don't want to smile back at us, we understand.

At 2:25 we start to put everything away and collect the signs in. All that's left to do is place the order for the next delivery.

#### ALL SAINTS' WACTON RESTORATION UPDATE

We were delighted that our initial application to the National Heritage Lottery Fund for the extensive work required on the church was successful. We have to pass three application stages in order to secure Lottery funding – 'The Expression of Interest', the 'Development Phase' and the 'Delivery Phase'. We are now planning to submit the next stage of our application (the Development Stage) at the end of February. We should learn the outcome by the end of June. Please don't expect to see any work on the church yet – the Lottery is handing out large sums of money and unsurprisingly the application process is protracted and very thorough. We produce an emailed newsletter to inform people of what is happening and updating on progress. If you would like to be added to our mailing list please email wactonchurch@gmail.com. The temperature really did read 2 degrees in the car on the way home. It made a nice cup of tea after a brisk walk even more enjoyable.


